

REGIONAL DISTRICT OF CENTRAL OKANAGAN

BYLAW NO. 661

Being a bylaw to establish an extended service for providing the services of Regional Crime Prevention.

WHEREAS Sections 789 and 790 of the Municipal Act provide for the establishment and operation of extended services within the Regional District of Central Okanagan;

AND WHEREAS pursuant to Section 790 of the Municipal Act, the Lieutenant Governor by, B.C. Regulation 552/95, has granted the Regional District of Central Okanagan with the additional power to provide Regional Crime Prevention as an extended service;

AND WHEREAS the participating areas include all of Electoral Areas G, H and I, The Corporation of the District of Peachland the District of Lake Country;

AND WHEREAS under Section 800(1)(b), the Regional Board has waived the assent requirements of Section 795(2)(a)(i) of the Municipal Act;

AND WHEREAS under Section 799 of the Municipal Act, the Councils of The Corporation of the District of Peachland and the District of Lake Country have waived the assent requirements of Section 795(2)(a)(i);

AND WHEREAS under Section 800(2) of the Municipal Act, the Directors of Electoral Areas G, H and I, have consented in writing to the adoption of this bylaw;

NOW THEREFORE the Regional Board of the Regional District of Central Okanagan in open meeting, assembled, enacts as follows:

1. The Regional District of Central Okanagan hereby establishes an Extended Service for the purpose of providing Regional Crime Prevention within Electoral Areas G, H and I, and The Corporation of the District of Peachland and the District of Lake Country.
2. The boundary in the named extended service under Section 1 are the boundaries of Electoral Areas G, H and I, and The Corporation of the District of Peachland and the District of Lake Country.
3. Electoral Areas G, H, I, and the Districts of Lake Country and Peachland shall be the participating areas in this extended service.
4. As provided for in Section 805(1) of the Municipal Act, the Annual Cost of providing the service shall be recovered by the requisition of money under Sections 809 and 809.1 of the Municipal Act, to be collected by a property value tax to be imposed in the manner provided by Section 810s and 810.1 of the Municipal Act, and to be levied on land and improvements within the extended service area. The maximum annual amount requisitioned for the purposes of this bylaw is (\$60,000) sixty thousand dollars.

5. The costs of providing the service shall be apportioned among the participating areas on the basis of converted values of land and improvements.
6. That Crime Prevention include the services as outlined in Schedule A as attached herein.
7. This bylaw may be cited as "Regional District of Central Okanagan Regional Crime Prevention Extended Service Establishing Bylaw No. 661, 1996."







SCHEDULE "A"

REGIONAL DISTRICT OF CENTRAL OKANAGAN

REGIONAL CRIME PREVENTION EXTENDED SERVICE ESTABLISHING BYLAW

1. SERVICE DESCRIPTION

Crime Prevention for the purposes of this Bylaw would include the following:

- (a) The encouraging of individuals to participate in, and service clubs to contribute towards the financing of Crime Prevention programs.
- (b) The overseeing of the operation of and supervision of volunteers working in Community Policing stations.
- (c) Assistance in the establishing of additional Community Policing stations in various communities within the participating areas and municipalities as outlined in this Bylaw.
- (d) The training of volunteers required to staff Community Police stations.
- (e) Assistance in the establishing and maintaining of such Crime Prevention programs as Block Parent, Ski Watch, Realty Watch and Neighbourhood Watch throughout the participating areas as described herein.
- (f) Analysis of crime patterns and the identifying of the need for preventative initiatives and delivery of those initiatives within the participating areas described herein together with other programs which would support and assist crime prevention initiatives, including educational programs in schools and in the community.
- (g) Liaison and training of Citizens Patrol organizations.
